About Brock University

Located at the centre of Canada's beautiful Niagara Peninsula in St. Catharines, Ont., Brock University is the only Canadian university with the distinction of being part of a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve.

The University offers strong undergraduate, graduate and interdisciplinary degree programs that include co-op and other experiential learning opportunities to a student population of about 17,000.

Brock University graduates continue to enjoy one of the highest employment rates of all Ontario universities at 97.5 per cent. Brock celebrates the success of its 63,000 graduates who apply their degrees to careers throughout Canada and

around the world.

The quality of education at Brock University continues to score high marks with students who gave the University a grade of A- in the *Globe and Mail's* 2008 University Report Card.

Our commitment to the individual student and to the highest standards of teaching and research excellence is reflected in the strong applications to Brock.

Brock students can expect the close, personal attention of a dedicated faculty and the opportunity to explore their academic interests through participation in seminars and labs.

The University is expanding the number of programs offered at the undergraduate and graduate levels and is introducing new co-op programs across all Faculties. Brock offers one of the largest selections of co-op programs in Canada.

The Matheson Learning Commons at Brock University, a new student space that occupies the first floor of the James A. Gibson Library, officially opened in October 2008.

As a result of a significant gift from former student Arthur Peltomaa (BA, econ/poli '74), the space was named in recognition of Professor Bill Matheson's important contribution to the growth and success of Brock.

Some of the features of the facility, which fosters and supports informal learning, include eight group study rooms that can be reserved, a

variety of study areas, a career resource centre for assistance with résumés, interview skills and job searches, new public computers, a help desk for library research support, and a learning centre for drop-in help.

The University also operates a campus in Hamilton, Ont., that is used primarily for teacher education.

Brock serves the Niagara region as a cultural, academic and recreational centre and offers the community excellent facilities for people of all ages.

Brock's annual economic impact on the Niagara region is estimated at \$265 million.

The Brock campus is an inclusive and friendly environment. The park-like

setting of the University, with its wide-open spaces, offers a number of outdoor activities at any time of the year.

Opened in 1964, Brock was named for Maj.-Gen. Sir Isaac Brock, who lost his life at Queenston Heights in the War of 1812. His last words are said to be, "Surgite! Push on!" — which have become the University's motto.




